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## Getting Hoards of Traffic to Your Landing Pages

Traffic is, in many ways, the lifeblood of the internet itself. Streams of people going from website to website – that’s what makes the internet the powerful medium of communication and information that it is today.

As a marketer though, traffic should represent something slightly different to you.

After all, the traffic that you can obtain and channel to your landing pages, those are not just visitors. To you, they are potential customers, each and every one of them. They are your potential list subscribers.

Putting up a great landing page is all well and good. Having it written by a professional and renowned copywriter is a definite plus. But all of that amounts to nothing if you can’t get enough people to the landing page itself.

If no one reads the greatest copy, or sees the most brilliant landing page, then it is all wasted. So, needless to say, you want as much traffic as you can to get to your landing pages, so that more people can view them, and be entranced by them.

Of course, it is easy to say that, but it is quite another thing to go out there and actually do it.

In fact, many beginners tend to stumble at this point. They know that they *need* traffic, and know that they *want* it, but just don’t know *how* to get it.

Well, that’s exactly what this book is about – how to get the traffic that you want, and need, to your landing pages. As we move forward, we’ll be looking at traffic generation methods, coupled with a swathe of useful tips and tricks that will help you on your way.

Hang on a second though. Before we get into the thick of things as far as traffic generation goes, we’re going to cover a topic that could really be a huge factor in determining your success or failure as a marketer.

It is, arguably, one of the most important things as far as traffic generation is concerned too.

Here and now, you’re going to start to realize that all traffic isn’t equal, and that there is a ‘right’ kind of traffic that you want to get to your landing pages. With that ‘right’ kind of traffic, you’ll also realize that you’re really setting yourself up for great success.

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On the flip side, with the wrong kind of traffic, well, the results that you will obtain are dubious, to say the least.

## **“What is the ‘Right’ Kind of Traffic?”**

Simple. The ‘right’ kind of traffic is the kind of traffic that suits *your* requirements best.

Admittedly, that isn’t an answer that really explains much, so let’s go a little bit deeper into it. Best way we can do that is simply by thinking about things a little: What are your requirements as far as traffic goes?

Naturally, seeing as you’re marketing, you want traffic that is going to fulfill your agenda as a marketer (which is, to sell products). Commonly that means either getting traffic that actually buys stuff, or is interested in buying stuff.

Speaking of interest, of course any traffic that you get is going to have to be interested in the type of product you’re offering. Or in other words, they’re going to have to be targeted to your niche.

See, that wasn’t so hard, was it? Summing up what we just went through, you’re basically looking for targeted traffic that will convert to sales.

Or, in the case of building a list, you’re looking for targeted traffic that is willing to join your list, and open to the possibility of buying what you market to them.

That’s going to be the ‘right’ kind of traffic as far as you’re concerned. Because that particular type of traffic fills your requirements, you’re going to want to go all out in order to get it. That means pulling out all the stops.

Sometimes, especially when directing the traffic to a landing page, it is somewhat hard to determine whether or not they’re a ‘buyer’ or just a freebie-seeker. Don’t worry though, as long as your traffic is targeted, it is still going to perform well.

Ideally, you’d want to do as much as you humanly can to get as many buyers in your traffic.

Great, that’s all there is to it. Right now, the only question that remains is a very simple one, but with some pretty tough answers: How is it possible to get hoards of traffic to a landing page, and what’s the best way to do so?

Now would be a good time to note that there is no ‘best’ way of getting traffic. Instead, there are many options from which you can try out, and choose, what works best for *you*.

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Bottom line, generating traffic has no one-size-fits-all solution. And, trying to recommend one solution above and beyond all others would just mean that you're going to lose out on the many other possibilities that might actually work just as well, or better.

Enough preamble though, let's get started with our traffic generation!

## **Generating Traffic and Directing it to a Landing Page**

Knowing the criteria that you want from your traffic is one thing, but getting that sort of traffic is something else entirely. Right here, right now, we're going to deal with getting that traffic, and reveal the wealth of options that you have to do so.

Some of these methods may sound familiar, and some may even be the kind of stuff you've tried before. But if you *have* tried any method here before, and it *hasn't* worked, then you might find a small tip or trick that will help you out.

Sometimes, getting traffic is all about the little things – the small nuances and tricks that can boost your results by tenfold.

So if you're interested in obtaining results, in the form of subscribers and customers to your list, then you're about to find out how you can get huge amounts of the *exact* kind of traffic that will allow you to do just that.

Buckle up, and let's kick things off by looking at the most traditional source of traffic out there:

### **Search Engines**

Ever since the internet was young, search engines have been used to navigate it. Of course they've changed over the years, and new, improved versions have popped up to replace their older counterparts.

Still, search engines remain the single-largest source of traffic on the internet, and so they deserve to be discussed.

Unfortunately, things aren't all that simple when it comes to using search engines as a source of traffic for your landing pages. Mostly, this stems from the fact that you'll need to do certain things in order to get traffic from search engines.

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Before we look at the downside though, let's glance through what exactly it will take in order for you to get traffic from search engines that you can count on, day in, day out, 24 hours a day, and 7 days a week.

## 1. Keyword Targeting

In order to get targeted traffic through search engines, it isn't enough that you just put up a page there. No, the actual content of the page needs to be keyword targeted.

If you're scratching your head, then this might help you: A keyword is just a word or phrase that people might use to search for what you're offering. As you can guess, some keywords are more widely used, and some can be more targeted.

For example, if you're selling a weight loss book, then 'buy weight loss books' would be a really targeted keyword since the people who search for that keyword would be buyers who are interested in what you have to offer.

Can't get too much better than that.

To find keywords, and get a rough idea as to their popularity, head over to [Google's Keyword Tool](#) and scope it out. Once you come up with a couple of keywords that you want to target, you'll need to make sure they're 'inserted' into the content of your page.

**Note:** Don't 'stuff' keywords in too much, just have one to three appearances of each keyword per 100 words.

By doing this, you'll position your page in the right sort of 'categories' where the people who find it will be precisely the right kind of traffic that you need.

## 2. Backlinks

Apart from keyword targeting, the other important aspect of harnessing search engine traffic that we're going to look at is: backlinks. Admittedly, not all search engines may use them in their 'ranking' algorithms (the thing that decides what listings appear first), but Google does.

And since Google is the largest search engine out there, in terms of usage, well... it is a good idea to focus on it.

Backlinks, on the whole, are not complicated really. A backlink is just a link that points to your webpage. Some search engines count these, and view them as 'votes' in the favor of that webpage.

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Of course, not all backlinks have the same type of 'value'. Tests have shown that backlinks from sources that are regarded as being more valuable can produce far greater results.

For example, some of the most valuable backlinks come from websites that have '.gov' or '.edu' extensions as opposed to the more commonplace '.com', '.org' or '.net'. Seeing as '.gov' and '.edu' imply government or educational institute, their vote carries more weight.

We're going to leave backlinks at that for now, but over the course of this book, you'll see how some other methods will allow you to build backlinks while *also* generating traffic.

Seeing as you now have a decent idea of what it takes to generate traffic from search engines, do you see the problem that you might face trying to apply that to your landing page? Not yet? Let's think about it a little.

Ideally, your landing page should be a piece of carefully crafted copy, which is designed to convert traffic. However, you also know that in order to get the kind of traffic that you want from search engines, you'll have to use keyword targeting.

This means that you're going to have to alter your carefully crafted copy to incorporate certain phrases.

At times, keywords can be inserted very smoothly into the copy, not adversely affecting it at all. But for the most part, trying to insert too many keywords ends up making the copy a lot less compelling, and flow a lot less smoothly.

Can this be overcome?

Well, it can't exactly be overcome. Instead, you have got to realize that at the end of the day, it isn't worth risking the persuasive nature of your copy. Thus, what you should do is insert a few relevant keywords at places where they do not affect the copy itself, if that's possible.

After that, your entire focus as far as search engines go should be limited to acquiring backlinks.

Sure, this means that you won't be getting the most out of search engine traffic, but as you'll see over the course of this book, search engines are just one of the ways in which you can source traffic.

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In fact, there are so many other alternatives, that some people choose to ignore search engines at all, when dealing with landing pages.

End of the day, the choice is up to you, but just remember that the focal point of your landing page should always be its persuasive copy, and not anything else.

## **Article Marketing**

Just a little while ago, we mentioned that there were some ways in which you could build backlinks while also getting a steady stream of traffic. Now, we're going to look at one of those ways: Article marketing.

Depending on who you ask, you'll often find mixed opinions regarding article marketing. Some say that it doesn't work at all, while others would state that it is one of the most powerful and easy ways to get traffic.

Why are there so many contrary opinions?

In part, it is probably due to the fact that article marketing isn't as easy as may first be expected. A lot of beginners think that if they just post as many articles as they possibly can, they'll end up getting the desired results.

While bulk would certainly help backlinks, it doesn't help very much when it comes to traffic.

Honestly speaking, if you carry out article marketing in a well thought out and methodical manner though, you'll be able to see firsthand that the results which you can obtain are nothing short of remarkable.

So how do you do that?

### **1. Keyword Targeting**

Considering your article is a webpage, despite it not being on your webpage, you'll still need to target it so that people get to it, and read it. Of course, this means using keywords, in exactly the same way that we discussed earlier.

Unlike landing pages though, you don't have to worry as much about damaging your articles persuasive copy. True, you shouldn't 'flood' your article with keywords and make it unappealing, but you will find that you're much more able to design an article around the keywords themselves.

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By doing this, you'll be able to position your article with search engines, and that's where article marketing really can get powerful.

Essentially you're tapping into the page rank (a number from 1 to 10 that Google uses to measure webpages), and reputation of the article directory to which you're submitting your article. Thus, your article will rank higher than it would if you posted it on a new, fresh, website.

Also, you're going to be able to target more keywords, since there is no limit on the number of articles you can produce. Each of these will turn into an 'advertisement' for your landing page.

In this way, you can somewhat overcome the limitation of landing pages as far as getting traffic from search engines is concerned.

## 2. Writing a Good Article

Although we aren't going to go through writing a good article entirely, since that's a whole different kettle of fish, what we can do is give you the outline that you're trying to achieve.

With any article that you intend to use for article marketing, you must have a few key ingredients.

Firstly, you need a good headline that can grab attention. Then, you need to build on that attention and create an interest in the topic that you're discussing. Following that, you should make the reader desire the outcome which you intend to suggest.

**Remember:** Never conclude your article within its body. Let it flow directly to the resource box.

In the resource box, you're going to have your link, and a call to action. This 'outline' that we just gave you is really a system of writing known as AIDA (Attention-Interest-Desire-Action), and there are a lot of resources online where you'd find more in depth advice.

One very important thing to remember is that your resource box is probably one of the more crucial aspects of your article. Of course, the entire article itself has to be good enough to get people to read it through to the finish, but it is the resource box that is the real deal clincher.

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Incentivizing your resource box is one of the most effective ways to get people to actually click on the backlink that is there. Don't just tell people to click it, tell them why they should click it, and what's in it for them.

Entice them as much as you possibly can, either with the promise of free gifts, or super-secret knowledge. Anything works really, just so long as it is a compelling reason.

And, it also needs to be a reason that makes it seem like, after reading the article, the only logical option is to click the link and continue on.

Experiment as much as possible in this regard, because, if you can pull off this, and the first step of keyword targeting, then you'll have people finding your article through a search engine, reading it, and clicking the link to get to your landing page.

Nice way to get traffic, right?

### 3. **Further Promotion**

One final 'step' to your article marketing is going to be the further promotion that you afford it. Certainly, you've already tapped into the high page rank of some article directory, but you could do more.

By 'more' this means pushing it higher up the search engine rankings so that it gets more clicks.

And as you should have guessed, that means building more backlinks to your article itself. Normally, this is done through social bookmarking, which we'll look at a little later on.

Yes, article marketing can be powerful if done correctly, but it really does need to focus on the key points that we've mentioned. Otherwise, if it is not keyword targeted and well-written, it probably will produce mediocre results, if any.

But for a pretty easy, and free, way to get traffic, it definitely is an attractive option that you should pursue.

### **Pay-Per-Click (PPC) Advertising**

First, a word of warning: PPC advertising is not the easiest thing in the world for a beginner to get into. There are many nuances, and it can take a lot of trial and error before you really find what works for you.

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That said, it is remarkably powerful once you do.

Basically, PPC advertising revolves around networks, such as [Google's Adwords](#), where anyone can sign up, and start their own advertising program. As the name implies, you pay for every click on an advertisement of yours.

Of course, this is quite appealing seeing as you're paying not for the appearance, but for the actual visitors to your web page.

Still, it can get a little more complicated than that. Running a PPC campaign is something that takes a lot of practice, and there are several concepts that you should understand about PPC campaigns.

Firstly, the way it works is that you 'bid' on the amount you're willing to pay per click for the keywords that you're targeting. Don't just think that you can bid low though, because that bids determines how frequently your advertisement will appear.

Of course, this depends on the number of other bids, as well as how high they are.

Needless to say, the ideal situation for you would be to find some keyword that has very few other bids, and yet is popularly searched. If you can find a few such keywords, then you're pretty much set – at least, until others start to bid on those keywords too.

Running an effective PPC campaign would therefore mean constantly looking for such keywords, and checking the performance of existing keywords and tweaking them accordingly.

Furthermore, your advertisement itself should also be tweaked and altered as much as possible until it is producing good results. Because of the small space of PPC advertisements, every word really does count when it comes to this form of advertising.

Go ahead and try out PPC advertising, but really, unless you're willing to take the steep learning curve that is part and parcel of it, as well as able to pay the cost associated with this type of advertising, it isn't the best idea.

Within niches that are highly popular, and have a lot of competing bids, it could be very costly for you to get a decent amount of appearances for your advertisements. And it would also be very difficult to find keywords that aren't being bid on but are still popular.

Of course, if you get good at it, then your profits will probably far outweigh the cost of advertising, which is why it is truly one of the best traffic generation methods around.

## **Forums, Blog Commenting, and Social Networks**

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What do all of these share in common? Well, they're basically places where you can find large groups of people that share similar interests. And in this case, the type of interests that you're looking for is an interest in your niche in particular.

For every niche, there are almost bound to be social networks, blogs, and forums where people go to discuss their experiences, likes, dislikes, and any other miscellaneous related things to that particular niche. More popular niches will, of course, have more such sites.

As a marketer, it is in your best interest to tap into the raw potential of such places. Basically, you could look at them as a ready made market full of people, and all that you need to do is find some way to convince them to visit your landing page.

In the particular case of forums, the most commonly accepted way to do this is using your signature. But, it isn't as simple as just placing your signature and starting to post, seeing as anything social-based is a place where reputation plays a huge role.

Consider this: If two members of a forum make a post, and one is a veteran who is widely known and his opinion is valued more, while the other is a completely new member of the forum, whose post do you think will get the most attention?

Naturally, it would be the veterans. Even if the new member made some excellent points, his post would not generate the same kind of interest as the veterans would.

So the initial focus when joining a new forum should definitely be on establishing yourself and gaining some standing within the community that the forum itself forms. Being helpful, offering good advice and useful tips, these are the kinds of things that will make people remember you, and later, be much more willing to listen to what you have to say.

Similarly, blog commenting on popular blogs, and even social networks, also follow the same sort of reputation-based rules.

While you're posting, commenting, and using social networks, you'll also be building quite a steady number of backlinks, which isn't too bad in itself. That part is easy though, the tough part really is getting them to be a valuable source of traffic.

However, if you do manage to gain a good and solid reputation within such forums, blogs and social networks that are related to your niche, then it is the kind of thing you can tap into again, and again, and again – for any and all landing pages that you might design related to your niche.

In short, for as long as you continue to be a productive member of these websites, you will be able to also continue to reap the rewards that come along with it.

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And that is certainly something that is worth doing.

Incidentally, another similar type of site worth considering is newsgroups. They're pretty much like forums though, and again, reputation is the key to unlocking them.

## **Social Bookmarking**

Have you heard of sites such as Digg.com or Technorati.com? They're basically social bookmarking websites where anyone at all can go and add bookmarks that they deem to be interesting.

So that means that you could go to one of these websites, add your landing page as a bookmark, and let others see it.

Okay, so it doesn't sound all that powerful initially, but it really can be for two main reasons. Firstly, due to the fact that there are a huge number of these social bookmarking websites, and it is easy to post a bookmark, you could get a large number of bookmarks up. That means, a large number of backlinks.

Secondly, if your landing page, or the product that it is offering, has enough of a 'wow' factor, then you could end up getting a lot of traffic too. Remember though, it needs to be something that's really going to appeal to people.

A lot of the way that social bookmarking works is centered on hype-factors. More hype would definitely generate more interest, so anything and everything that you can do to help it out in that regard is going to pay off with this kind of traffic generation.

On the backlink building side though, well, social bookmarking is quite simply the easiest way to get a lot of decent backlinks. Remember how we mentioned it for article marketing? Well, seeing as you could easily backlink articles in this way, it really is advantageous to get that little extra boost.

**Note:** There have been suggestions that the traffic from social bookmarking websites tend to have a high 'bounce' rate, which means that people visiting your landing page through a social bookmark may tend to not stick around to actually read it. Still, it is so easy to do that it is worth trying out to see if that really does happen in your particular case.

End of the day, you can't go wrong by at least trying out social bookmarking. It costs nothing, is easy, and isn't even time consuming at all.

Who knows what you could achieve with it.

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## Summing Up the Traffic Generation Methods

Well, well, well. We've gone over some of the top traffic generation methods, all of which can certainly help you get hoards of traffic to your landing pages. But is there more that can be done, or is that all that you need to know?

Here's one thing that you should remember when marketing: There is *always* more that can be done.

And that is certainly true as far as getting traffic is concerned. Sure, we've covered many of the options that you have at your disposal... but there are other things that can be just as powerful, or even more so.

Let's look at a few of these now, and maybe you'll see what I mean.

## Other Techniques to Get Hoards of Traffic

Despite the fact that we've really been pretty comprehensive so far, there are a few things that we haven't yet covered. Can you guess what they are?

If you can, then great, you're probably a little ahead of the curve already. But chances are that you really aren't sure, and that's not really a big problem since you're going to be finding out about them now.

Granted, these are techniques that can help you get hoards of traffic, but they aren't, strictly speaking, traffic generation. Instead, fall into a somewhat miscellaneous 'others' category that is slightly mysterious in nature.

But what they are, are the kind of techniques that can really and truly boost your traffic ratings.

This is the stuff from which huge lists can be grown, with even less effort than you might spend on the more traditional traffic generation styles.

Are you ready to get started?

### The Magic Word: Free

There is something about this one word that absolutely pulls people to it. Free. As in, will cost them nothing, and they really don't have anything to lose, except maybe a few minutes spent on downloading whatever it is that you're offering.

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If you're offering something free, then you can be sure that people will end up coming to your landing pages.

For this reason, designing a landing page that is basically there to give off something free, and gather emails while it does so, is one of the most popular list-building techniques on the internet.

On top of that it really does serve a dual purpose. After all, if people like whatever it was that you gave them for free, then they're already going to trust you more, and it will help build your reputation – which is something that you can use to your advantage in the future.

In a nutshell, you'll be building your list and getting a nice reputation boost, all rolled up into one nice package.

But what can you give people for free that would be considered valuable?

Well, for the most part, the most common item that is given away free are reports. Normally, they vary from between 7 to 10 pages in length or so, but you could give away something even larger if you really want to.

By selecting topics that will appeal to whatever niche you're in, you could ensure that people are grateful and happy at the free item that they've just received.

Of course, it doesn't have to be a report, it could really be anything. If you really want to, you could even give away a Ferrari (though that might be quite expensive), or anything else that you see fit.

Use your imagination, and make sure that it is something that's going to appeal to the niche in which you want to market further through the list that you build.

Then, even with minimal exposure, you'll find that you receive a lot more attention, and a lot more sign ups to your list. Without a doubt, this could get you where you want to be going much faster than you might expect.

## **Affiliate Marketing**

Maybe you've been an affiliate before, and maybe you still are. But why is it that people are willing to part with 75% or so of the selling price of an item just to get others to sell their products?

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Partly, it is because they don't lose anything at all by doing so, and stand to get a lot more customers than they would otherwise. Having affiliates is, after all, like having your very own marketing team working for you.

But the larger part, and the reason that not many beginners realize is, that although the profits from the sale itself are shared, the people who are actually selling the products are building their own list.

That way, after the initial sale, they can continue to market to that list – and make further profits while doing so.

Which is a great technique to get tons of traffic: Let others do the marketing for you.

Of course, you need to have a pretty good product and be willing to part with a good portion of the profits. But otherwise, it is an incredibly powerful technique. Best part is, you won't need to do a thing except ensure that you pay your affiliates on time, and maybe even give them perks for exceptional performance.

Still, there is more to affiliate marketing than just the theory, and if you want to try this technique, powerful as it is, you might find that it doesn't work as fantastically as you initially expected.

In many ways, how well this technique works depends on the product that you're offering, the quality of your landing page, and also, how much profit your affiliates are going to end up making.

So long as you can get those three main factors spot on, you should find that you'll get good results.

Try places such as [Clickbank.com](http://Clickbank.com) to start out with – they have a huge number of frequent affiliates that are constantly looking for new products to promote.

Another similar technique to this would be Joint Ventures. With joint ventures, you can get other marketers to promote your product to their lists, and then when the product is bought, add some of their subscribers to your own list.

Either way, whether you choose to go the path of affiliate marketing or just joint ventures, you should spare a few thoughts considering these options, at very least. Getting hoards of traffic in this way is one of the easier things to do.

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And once you have a popular product, you'll actually be earning money while others help you build your list. Really, it is a no-lose situation that you shouldn't miss out on, or put off for some later date.

## **Product Previews**

Actually, this could be viewed as sort of an extension of the 'free' idea, because, well, it involves giving away something free. Still, it is effective enough that it's a good idea for us to discuss it on its own.

Imagine for a second that you had a number of products that you intended to market. But, of course, you are also not really that established a marketer yet, so you want to build up a list as well.

If you had something free to give away, that would be great, but there is an alternative.

Instead of giving away one of the products that you intend to market, why not give away part of it, at least. Assuming it is an eBook, or something along those lines, then that's not too hard to accomplish.

All that you'll need to do is bundle a portion of that eBook into its own, standalone report, while also previewing, possibly in a 'Content Page', the rest of what the full version would contain.

Think about it a little, and you realize that many companies already do this in a number of ways, from handing out samples of perfume; right down to allowing downloads of software with 'limited' features, and requiring a payment to get or activate the full versions.

To do it yourself, all you need is your own product, and whatever little know-how that is required to be able to portion off part of it into its own, independent, product.

Why would you want to do this though? Well, instead of just giving away something free and then marketing a totally new product the next time around, this allows you to tap into the 'free' factor, while still actually promoting a product that you could profit from.

In fact, if the 'preview' version is good enough, chances are you'll actually persuade whoever downloads it to buy the full version.

And throughout it all, you'll also be building your list and be able to continue to market to it later on. Basically, you stand to lose nothing, while making a nice profit and building your list at the same go.

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As a traffic-puller, it certainly has its appeal, and not just because of the 'free factor'. Knowing that it is part of a larger program, and that it provides great information, people naturally feel like trying a sample.

Just to add a cherry to it all, there's also the possibility that you could easily start sorting your list itself into 'buyers' and 'non-buyers' by seeing who goes on to purchase the full version, and who doesn't.

Not too shabby, right?

### **Summing up the Other Techniques to Get Hoards of Traffic**

With these three techniques that we've gone over below your belt, you'll certainly have a decent enough edge to allow you to build your list pretty quickly. Remember though, it is all about the implementation, so be sure to plan things out right.

Don't get too caught up thinking about being completely 'perfect' though. Not even the most famous 'guru' ends up pulling things off 'perfectly', so there is no reason to expect that your efforts will be.

Try things out, make mistakes, learn from them. That's how you'll end up really building a list.

And since you now know more than enough things to try out, it is time for just a few final words before we leave you to go get those hoards of traffic.

### **Final Words on Traffic**

Yes, now it is time to turn theory into action, and knowledge into results. That's what you need to do, and the sooner you start doing it, the sooner you'll be able to see the results that you want.

Besides, there really isn't much more that you need to know, so your only choice is to go out there and start using what you do know.

Remember though, at the end of the day, traffic is made up of living, breathing, human beings. So while you may do everything possible to get hoards of traffic, and while you may even succeed, it's all going to be pointless if the landing page that you direct them too isn't up to scratch.

Traffic generation may seem fairly robotic, but what you do with the traffic itself definitely isn't.

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Don't ever make the mistake of thinking that just because you can get hoards of traffic, you needn't worry about tweaking and optimizing other aspects of your landing pages. Those aspects are what could very well be the difference between success and failure too.

After all, even getting a million hits a day is pretty pointless if none of those hits end up signing up.

Thankfully some of the techniques we've suggested should help you out in that regard (i.e. free reports), but just remember that there's more to traffic than just numbers.
